Readiness to Train Assessment Tool (RTAT)



What is it?

A 41-item, 7-subscale validated survey instrument that covers dimensions of health center readiness for engaging with Health Professions Training (HPT) programs that were deemed critical to evaluate by subject matter experts.

A contact at MNACHC will send the survey to an identified individual at each FQHC. This individual will then send out the survey to employes.

How is it distributed?

Who fills it out?

HRSA recommends all employees at an FQHC fill out the survey. However, it is ultimately up to each FQHC to determine who they think should take the survey.

HRSA has directed all FQHCs to use the RTAT in order to address concerns regarding capacity, resources, and organizational abilities when launching any health professions training program(s). The results from the RTAT will be used to create strategic workplans for each FQHC.
